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President's Letter



Dear Friends of Junior Achievement,

I am pleased to present the FY24 Annual Report for Junior Achievement of Southeastern PA. This past year marked significant growth as we began implementing our three-year strategic framework. Our focus has been on ensuring young people are equipped for economic mobility and the pursuit of their ambitions.

During the 2023-24 school year, over 27,000 young people across Southeastern Pennsylvania learned financial literacy, became work-ready, created businesses, and engaged in real-world learning experiences.

We prioritized supporting young people in under-resourced communities, focusing on middle and high school students. By the end of the school year, we had shifted many of our learning experiences to target middle and high schools, keeping us on track for our goal by 2026 to serve 75% middle and highschoolers, and focusing on communities where 75% of young people in from under-resourced communities.

A major highlight was the focus on preparing for the expansion of JA Finance Park® to include a transportable in-person simulation, allowing young people to practice skills in a reality-based pop-up city. This innovative model supports our strategic framework and will increase JA SEPA's geographic reach.

Junior Achievement experiences are delivered by volunteers in collaboration with educators. I am in awe of the JA community's dedication and commitment to positive change. None of this would be possible without our donors, educators, partners, and volunteers.

During FY24, we served over **27,000** young people, including elementary, middle and high school students, and providing a variety of learning experiences. Below are a few program highlights:



JA Company Program®

200 Middle and High School students in the region started businesses through <u>JA Company Program</u>. Our host companies this year were: Accenture, Essential Utilities, Lincoln Investments, Pfizer, RSM, SAP America, and Resolution Life.

JA Finance Park Virtual®

1,200 students developed financial literacy skills and virtually practiced budgeting in **JA Finance Park Virtual**



JA Inspire - STEM®

1,300 Philadelphia High School students participated in hands-on STEM experiences during **JA Inspire** opening their eyes to new careers.

JA Job Shadow®

350 11th graders from Mastery Schools and the School District of Philadelphia got a hands-on glimpse at a "day in the life" at more than 15 local businesses through **JA Job Shadow**

700 business students from the School District of Philadelphia stretched their CEO skills, participating in the **JA Titan** simulation.







Fiscal Year 2023-24 JA SEPA's Financial Report
