A BRIEF HISTORY

Junior Achievement was founded in 1919 by Theodore Vail. president of American Telephone & Telegraph; Horace Moses, president of Strathmore Paper Co.; and Senator Murray Crane of Massachusetts. Its first program, JA Company Program[®], was offered to high school students on an after-school basis. In 1975, the organization entered the classroom with the introduction of Project Business for the middle grades. Junior Achievement has expanded its activities to include a blended-learning approach for both in-school and after-school students.

JA of Southeastern Pennsylvania was founded in 1951.
